From the Desk of Father Tim . . .

It does my heart good to see, once again, how great a start we are off to with this year's Catholic Ministries Appeal. Our parish responsibility this year is \$155,000 and as of last weekend (when I am writing this article) we are already at 34% of our goal. The average gift is over \$400 and we have had 111 households participate! More reports will be given as the CMA progresses.

Last week, I wrote about the pastoral ministries that are supported. There are other ministries that are not so well known, but which are just as vital. For example, your CMA gifts support the Vatican ministries, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the New York State Catholic Conference, the work and efforts of Bishop Matano, and the clerical and lay advisory councils that guide diocesan-wide decisions.

It so happens that I have just begun a three-year term as a member of one of those advisory councils known as the Presbyteral Council – a council of about 20 priests (some elected by our colleagues and some appointed by the Bishop). I think this is my sixth term since my ordination. The bishop also has councils that help him with finances, the assignment of priests among the various parishes, and for the development of various policies.

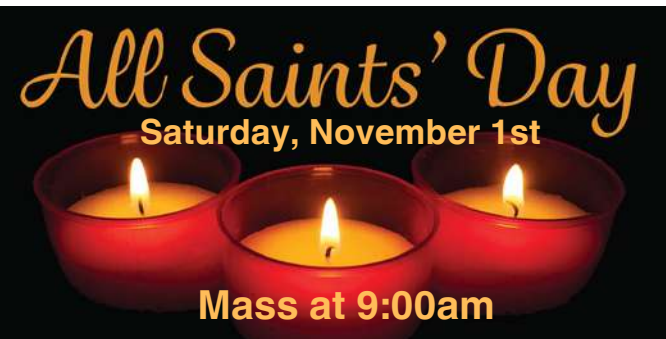
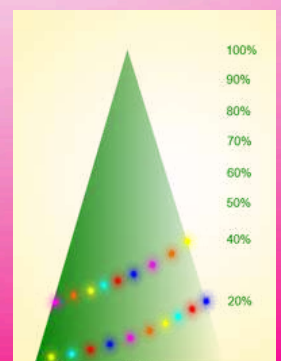

Reflections on Readings for Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time "O Lord, Be Merciful To Me, A Sinner"

For the third Sunday in a row, our readings focus on prayer. Two Sundays ago, we focused on prayers of praise and thanksgiving. Last Sunday's readings focused on the need for trust and



persistence in prayer. This Sunday, the focus is on coming to God with a humble and contrite heart. God listens especially to the poor, the oppressed and the humble sinner asking for mercy.

In our first reading ([Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18](#)), we hear that God is an equal opportunity giver of mercy. "Though not unduly partial toward the weak, yet He hears the cry of the oppressed." God has particular concern for the lowly and sufferers of injustice. God is ever the just judge, attentive to those in need of His mercy and to those who "serve God willingly."

In our Epistle reading ([2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18](#)), St. Paul continues his letter from prison to his protégé Timothy, as he contemplates his impending execution and martyrdom. At its heart, it is a prayer of praise and glory to God for allowing Paul the gift of his ministry to the Gentiles in total service to God. Even though his friends deserted him, his trust in God is what sustained him. Paul wrote, "The Lord will rescue me from every evil threat and will bring me safe to His heavenly kingdom."

In our Gospel reading ([Luke 18:9-14](#)), Jesus addressed this parable to those whose pride and conceit blinded them to God's mercy. He contrasted a boastful Pharisee with a humble and contrite tax collector whose shame and remorse was painfully evident. The Pharisee, it seems, was praying more to himself than to God and seemed to take all the credit for his life of good works. The Pharisee boasted of his station in life while despising everyone else. And yet the tax collector simply begged for mercy and forgiveness.

The Pharisee in today's Gospel did everything right; he followed every prescribed law, but his pride overshadowed and negated his good works. Pride is the opposite of "poor in spirit"; it isolates us from God's mercy. If we were to emulate one ethic in today's readings, it might be the tax collector's humility and true repentance for his sins, not judging others or feeling in any way better than others. Like the poor widow and orphan in today's first reading, we can simply take our sorrow and our troubles and lay them at the foot of the cross.

And then go and do justice to others.

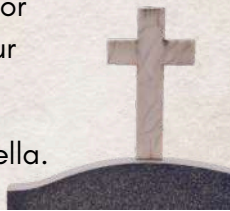

In May of this year, the Pastoral Council, who are chosen representatives of our parish at large, began looking at ways to live out Catholic Social Teaching and our St. Rita Parish mission of Joyfully Living the Gospel and Serving with Love. They began the process of selecting a ministry that St. Rita Parish can adopt, support, and with which it can build an ongoing relationship, providing regular volunteer opportunities for our parishioners who are hungering for a chance to serve.

At its June meeting, the Pastoral Council chose to adopt Rochester Hope. Rochester Hope is a nonprofit that began in October 2022 to “bring caring hands to the heart of our city”, located at 869 N. Clinton Avenue.

A planning committee has been formed and began meeting in September. The committee has members from the Pastoral Council and the Racial Justice Ministry. Since September, many members of both groups have visited and volunteered at Rochester Hope.

We would like to involve all those interested parishioners in this ministry. Please look for much more information soon for ways you can participate.

In the meantime, we would be grateful if you would pray this prayer for the success of this new St. Rita ministry.

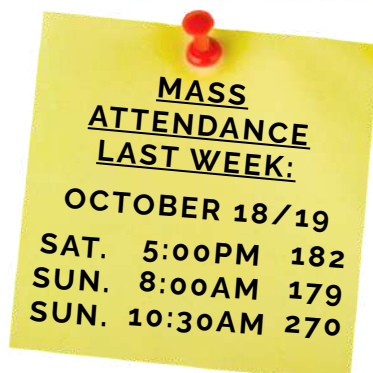
